Westcoast Energy Limited Partnership (Westcoast), an Enbridge affiliate, is proposing the Sunrise Expansion Program (Project), an expansion of the southern portion of its natural gas pipeline system, to meet the demand for natural gas—an affordable and reliable energy source used to heat homes and businesses, generate electricity and produce hundreds of products we use every day.

In response to Indigenous interests in Project participation, and to address the Canada Energy Regulator's (CER) Draft Condition 9, Westcoast has drafted an Indigenous Monitoring Plan (Plan). This Plan outlines how Indigenous members will be involved in monitoring activities during construction, if the Project is approved.

This information sheet summarizes the draft Plan to support further engagement with Indigenous groups to help finalize it.

Indigenous Monitoring Plan

The Plan incorporates Indigenous knowledge from more than 10,000 communications with Indigenous groups, including meetings, cultural walk-throughs, and review of community-led assessments.

The feedback received from these engagement efforts have been incorporated in several sections of the draft Plan. Key themes gathered during engagement include the need for capacity for meaningful participation; protection of cultural sites; protection of fish habitat, wildlife, and traditional plants; and inclusion of culturally relevant safety programs, including human trafficking and cultural awareness training.

Input from federal and provincial regulatory agencies, findings from the Project's environmental and socio-economic assessment and best practices in Indigenous participation and monitoring were also considered in the development of this Plan.

Indigenous monitoring program

Westcoast is committed to hiring Indigenous monitors and coordinators during the construction activities.

In the draft Plan, Westcoast provides detailed information about the roles and responsibilities of Indigenous participants, along with their training and certification requirements, reporting methods and frequency, and contractor oversight.

Roles and responsibilities

- Indigenous monitors will be tasked to observe, document and report daily construction activities to ensure environmental and cultural values are protected and respected.
- Monitors will submit daily reports which will include the locations visited, their observations, and any questions, concerns or actions taken to address issues.
- Coordinators will manage the monitors and facilitate their daily field assignments, on-site transportation and contact with other construction personnel.
- Coordinators will also prepare the weekly and monthly reports that will be shared with Indigenous groups and Westcoast.

Monitors will be deployed based on construction schedules and areas of interest identified by their respective communities or traditional territory. Monitoring activities may vary depending on the identified interests and concerns of the community.

Training and certification

All participants will complete the training required and provided by Westcoast, including:

- Pipeline construction work and safety
- Wildlife safety
- Human trafficking awareness and prevention
- Codes of conduct, and the After Hours and Respect for Community policies



Program participation

Several Indigenous groups have expressed an interest in participating in the program. Westcoast intends to enter into monitoring agreements with each community that will be finalized before construction begins. Westcoast remains open to new participation requests.
